#### Dear Community Councillors,

We are writing to provide you with an update on upcoming engagement opportunities for the Beauly - Peterhead overhead line project and advise that our Alignment Selection Report on Consultation has now been published.

### **Publication of the Alignment Selection Report on Consultation**

In May and June 2024, we presented our potential alignment for the overhead line, alongside potential alternatives, in a series of local events where we sought feedback on these proposals. The feedback period remained open until 2 August. The feedback provided from a range of different stakeholders led us to carry out further investigation in some areas and consider some changes to our proposals, delaying our intended publication date of late Autumn until now.

The Report on Consultation (ROC) provides a summary of the feedback received in response to proposals for the overhead line, how this has been considered, and confirmation of the final proposed overhead line route alignment (Proposed Development) intended to be taken forward for planning consent. #### Final Pre-Application (PAC) Alignment Consultation Events

These events conclude the Pre-Application Consultation (PAC) process for the consent application that we aim to submit for the Proposed Development to the Energy Consents Unit of the Scottish Government in Spring 2025. 
application will be submitted in line with the requirements of section 37 of the Electricity Act 1989.
